- 1. Welcome and Call to Order by Karen at 6:33 pm
  - a. Land Acknowledgement
  - b. Welcome and introductions
    - Joined tonight by Vice Principal Ashley Durbeniuk for a discussion about "Communication of Student Learning"
- 2. Review of Agenda

The discussion with Ashley was moved to the beginning of the meeting. Modified agenda was approved by Troy and seconded by Erin. All in favour. The presentation notes will still appear at the end of these minutes.

3. Approval of minutes from February 24, 2025

Erin moved to approve minutes as written. Jodie seconded. All in favour.

- 4. Reports and Information Items
  - a. Principal's Report (Mr. Kukurudza)
    - **Staffing:** A number of teachers are taking leaves of absence. These leaves will be covered internally and by substitutes who were previously CHHS staff members.
    - Quarter 4: Starts April 7. Particularly affects those students with quarterly options.
    - **Fire Drill:** A routine fire drill will take place on April 8.
    - **Standardized Testing:** The Provincial Government is transitioning to a digital platform for student assessment. PATs (Provincial Achievement Tests) will be written online by grade 9s this year. Grade 12 Diploma Exams will be handwritten this year using the traditional booklets, but next year will be online.
    - OurSchool Survey: This is the school's main tool for getting information and feedback from stakeholders for future planning. It is really helpful if all parents fill this out.
    - Inappropriate Language: A parent expressed concern about the disrespectful and inappropriate language their child is hearing at school. While it is hard to monitor when students are talking among themselves, the school strives to create a positive and respectful environment where all students feel safe. Mike stressed that racial, homophobic, and other hurtful and harmful words are not tolerated hate speech is a suspension offence. This is a topic that parents can discuss with their children at home to help the school address this issue.
  - b. Trustee's Report (Mr. Grisonich)
    - The trustees had a presentation on diversity, equity, and inclusion.

- A value-scoping exercise is underway to set priorities for modernizing existing schools and building new ones in the MHPSD.
- The Division will be hosting parents who want to participate in the ASCA online Spring Symposium (April 26).
- The Drama trip to New York was approved after a presentation to the Board.
- A mental health symposium is being planned by PSBAA (Public School Board Association of Alberta).
- MHPSD trustees and administrators are headed on a retreat in May to discuss priorities and set goals for the Division.
