Government Data Collection

- Provincial government tasked schools to provide data regarding classroom complexity.
- This was a huge undertaking, two vice-principals and CSTs worked full time for two weeks to compile and submit data regarding student coding and FMNI numbers.
- It is unclear how the data will be interpreted or broken down.
- Data was submitted on time.
- Administration is hoping for additional supports. The school currently has 8 EAs for 1300 students.
- Tools created by the government for data entry were inefficient.
- VP's were working OT to get data submitted.
- Dec 2nd Trustees will sit down with schools and kids for engagement sessions.

Strike Effects

- Final exams eliminated in January to regain teaching time.
- Exams still possible during class time.
- Diploma exams are outside our control.
- Opportunities for projects instead of exams.
- Focusing on a triangle of evidence. Kids are encouraged to speak to teachers, determine if there are other ways to assess students' needs.
- Administrators and teachers want to work with kids to demonstrate understanding.
- January 27th last day classes, 28th turn around day, 29th first day 2nd semester.

Discipline

- Few students require supports.

 - No fights.
 - Kids being kids, happy.

- Parent Engagement Initiatives
 - Ideas to get more parents/guardians/students involved in council
 - Special Topics/speakers
 - Interest in how AI is used in education, and how the schools are handling it.

- Discussing the importance of preparing students for future careers, including those that don't yet exist, and encouraging them to think about how they can contribute to solving societal problems.
- Have a \$500 grant for parent engagement, could be spent on a speaker.
 - Last year's grant was spent on ASCA conference and career cards.
- Wellness evening suggested by Joni.
 - Chance for parents and students to reconnect.

 - Signage in different languages in the school.
 - Grant must be used by the end of June or we lose it.

 - Video from kids in January.
