Commentary and Analysis: School reflections/comments: We are concerned about the low rating in citizenship and student learning engagement. This has been a large focus for our school team for the last two years. It may take some time for stakeholders to recognize the effect of changes being made. Perhaps some some time spent on celebrating positive changes in this area may be helpful. We have seen a significant decrease in disruptive student behaviours. Attendance is still a concern but we are working hard to create a sense of belonging to help counteract that. As a staff we are working through the "Responsibility Centred Discipline" model to help us be more consistent and effective as a team. We continue to be proud of our high school completion rates. This has been an important focus of our high school program. Our "Den" program allows for many flexible learning environments which has supported many students in their path to graduations

Commentary and Analysis: School reflections/comments: We are concerned with the perception that students do not model the characteristics of active citizenship. As a staff we have observed growth in this area. Sometimes it's tricky for individuals to see the large picture and reflect on only their own personal experiences or experience. We will continue to work to celebrate the students who are continuing to rise up in the area of citizenship.

Already we are finding students to be more engaged and less distracted. We are piloting APOP (Alberta Postsecondary Options Project) with our grade 12s as well as increasing promoting post secondary opportunities to all high school students to help with engagement.
